Well Done Students!

TLP students, tutors, and non-tutoring volunteers are off to another successful academic year. Since July, 2017:

- 110 adult learners have enrolled in our Adult Basic Education (ABE) and English as a Second Language (ESL) programs
- **3** passed their driver's permit tests
- **3** passed their driver's license tests
- 8 learned how to use a computer
- 3 passed all five subject area tests on the TASC (Test Assessing Secondary Completion) and earned their HSE (High School Equivalency) certificate
- **9** got a job for the first time or improved their employment

- **5** passed some of the subject area tests on the TASC (reading, writing, math, science, and/or social studies)
- **8** passed their interviews for United States citizenship

TLP students commit to meeting at least once per week with their tutors, for a minimum of two hours, to work on the literacy and life goals of their choice. We could not be prouder of our students and all they have accomplished while also balancing family, work, and other responsibilities.

Karaoke for a Cause



Partners in Literacy: International Literacy Day Celebration

In 1965, the United Nations declared September 8th as "International Literacy Day" to highlight the importance of literacy to individuals, communities and societies.

This year, TLP joined forces with the Tompkins County Public Library and Family Reading Partnership to set up a community event called "Read-Aloud Along the Commons." Volunteer readers from TLP, the TCPL, and FRP chose their favorite pieces to read aloud to passersby. While rain may have slowed traffic on the Commons that day, it did not dampen our readers' spirits! Recent Grants

The was fortunate to have recently received three grants. A grant of \$895.00 was received from the Friends of the Public Library for books for emerging readers who are at the beginning to intermediate reading level. Additionally, books were purchased for students studying for their high school equivalency diplomas.

The Legacy Foundation approved a \$2,500 request to be used to increase the hours of our part-time literacy instructor. As a result, the instructor is able to serve 12 students with low English literacy skills that otherwise would be waiting to be tutored.

These grants help us meet program needs as well as supplement funding that TLP receives from Tompkins County, the City of Ithaca, the NY State Education Department and United Way of Tompkins County.

What is the TASC Test?

TASC (Test Assessing Secondary Completion) is the test used in New York State—formerly called the GED.

The TASC test is similar to the GED in that there are 5 subject area tests that a student must pass in order to obtain their high school equivalency diploma. These tests include: Reading, Writing, Social Studies, Science and Math. Students at TLP work with their tutor to study for all of the sections of this exam. We have many dedicated and patient tutors working with students on this goal. We are actively recruiting additional tutors to help with study for this test—we have a particular need for additional math tutors! Students who pass the test are honored at a graduation ceremony with other BOCES Adult Education students in June. Last year, 7 TLP students passed the TASC test and for this academic year, we have already had 3 students pass!
