

Summer Interns at TLP


his summer, Tompkins Learning Partners hosted two interns who helped us with multiple special projects. Irina Peress is pursuing her Master of Social Work (MSW) degree at Binghamton University. She has been a TLP ESL tutor since 2016, and has a special interest in working with immigrants and refugees. With the help of her internship supervisors Shannon Alvord and Joann Kowalski, Irina presented a very well received workshop for tutors on boundaries and confidentiality. She also included information on how trauma impacts learning. In addition, Irina hosted a women's conversation group which was also very well



attended. She is now back at Binghamton University full time, but will continue to tutor at TLP. We are very grateful for her contributions to our organization and are pleased she'll remain connected to TLP.

Our second intern, Paw Beler Htoo, is a recent graduate of TC3, with a degree in Human Services. Paw Beler split her internship time

between Catholic Charities Immigrant Services Program and Tompkins Learning Partners. TLP and Catholic Charities are partners on the ONA (Office for New Americans) grant. As part of this project, Paw Beler translated materials for our citizenship students. Through Catholic Charities, she also helped organize women's health and social security benefits workshops for TLP students and for the wider immigrant and refugee community in Tompkins County. As a former TLP student, Paw Beler shared many valuable insights and experiences that will help us with program planning in the future. Paw Beler has achieved countless academic and personal goals since arriving in Ithaca and is truly a role model for her community. We are thankful for her help this summer and hope to work with her again soon.



Well Done Students!

Since July of 2019, TLP students and tutors have been hard at work. Here are just some of the students' remarkable accomplishments:

- 136 students enrolled in our Adult Basic Education (ABE) and English as a Second Language (ESL) Programs
- 70 retained or improved employment
- **9** got jobs for the first time
- 3 passed one or more of the subject area tests on the TASC (Test Assessing High School Completion)
- **5** entered a post-secondary education or training program
- **8** began volunteering in the community
- **10** passed the interview for United States Citizenship

TLP students commit to meeting at least once per week with their tutors, for a minimum of two hours, to work on the literacy and life goals of their choice. We could not be prouder of our students and all they have accomplished while also balancing family, work, and other responsibilities.

as they think they know the answer. The judge's control buzzer locks out those buzzing after. If the first responder is wrong, the other teams get a second




chance. Plan now to reserve a table to show the world how brainy you and your friends really are! More details will be available soon.

Recent Grants

Tompkins Learning Partners appreciates the support we receive from our community partners which helps provide TLP students and tutors with adequate resources and staff. Grants from local funders assist us in meeting program needs including providing resources for home-bound immigrant and refugee women, assessments for adult basic education students and electronic tablets enabling citizenship students to practice for the interview.



TLP volunteer tutors commit to at least one year of service and undergo orientation and initial training with staff. They also attend on-going workshops to keep their tutoring skills sharp. These dedicated volunteers work one-to-one or in small groups with their learning partners on literacy and life goals at least once per week. Students and staff truly appreciate their time, caring and dedication.

28 non-tutoring volunteers helped us with special events, like our Crossword and Karaoke fundraisers and hosting a shift at the Friends of the Library book sale.

Non-tutoring volunteers also manage the TLP lending library, maintain our reading garden and help us with administrative tasks such as mailings and record keeping.
