Here at Tompkins Learning Partners, we have been busy bringing in new students, training new tutors, and adjusting to all of the challenges that come with changing from the TASC to the GED. This includes updating our resources for tutors and students, as well as providing training opportunities to learn new information.

We have also been encouraging students who are transitioning from the TASC to the GED to return to in-person tutoring. We found that some of these students needed help with transportation, so we applied for a Women Building Community Grant from The City Federation of Women's Organizations. We are happy to report that they awarded us enough funds to purchase bus passes so we can now readily meet students' requests for passes

Tompkins Learning Partners was also able to apply for a grant from the United Way Youth and Philanthropy (YAP) Program to purchase books for our students' children. This was to promote reading in the home and help our students connect with their children through literacy. Our adult learners and their tutors also benefitted from books that were purchased with grants from The Social Service League of Ithaca and The Friends of the Tompkins County Public Library.

We look forward to a new fiscal year and the goals we can accomplish together. We hope to bring in more volunteer tutors as well as more students. We appreciate all of the support from the community!
